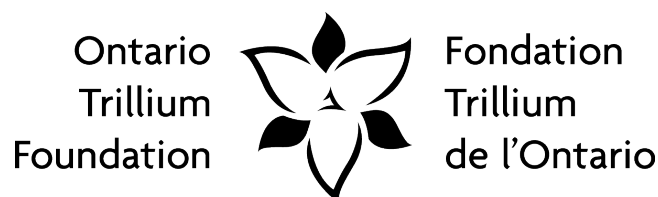

Message from the Chair and CEO


2021–2022 continued to expose the disparities brought or exacerbated by the global COVID-19 pandemic. For some, life began to return to normal — or at least a “new” normal — while others continued to struggle with disruptions to life at work and home. The urgency of ongoing needs was reflected in the fact that, for the second year in a row, the applications we received at the Ontario Trillium Foundation and the investments we disbursed were nearly double the norm. For 2021-2022 we awarded \$107 million more than we do in a typical year as a result of one-time funding specifically to support the non-profit sector

We were determined to respond as leanly, efficiently and cost-effectively as possible to keep essential dollars flowing into communities and non-profit organizations. That flow included our first-ever operating grants, via the Community Building Fund’s operating stream, which helped keep many organizations’ doors open, while its capital stream ensured sport and recreation facilities could address community need and comply with new public health guidance.

In 2022–2023, we will return our investment focus to our traditional capital funding stream while continuing to offer grants through the Resilient Communities Fund and the Youth Opportunities Fund. And we’ll be celebrating. OTF’s anniversary in November 2022 offers an opportunity to reflect on 40 years of growth and evolution, and to think forward about our hopes and aspirations for the decades to come. This is also the year that the Youth Opportunities Fund turns 10, a milestone in supporting youth and families.

As the year came to a close, we began to see signs of real recovery across Ontario’s not-for-profit sector: of a corner turned and possibilities beyond the pandemic. We’re excited to contribute to what’s next.

We could not conclude this letter without acknowledging the amazing work and dedication of our staff, board and volunteers. In another record year of demand, it was through aligned values and concerted action that we were able to respond effectively as an instrument of the Government of Ontario and make a real difference for communities and community organizations throughout the province.

The Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) is an agency of the Government of Ontario and one of Canada’s leading granting foundations. Our investments in local community organizations ensure the Government of Ontario is making an impact on the cultural and economic fabric of communities of all sizes and in all corners of the province.

Concluding the Local Poverty Reduction Fund

The **Local Poverty Reduction Fund (LPRF)** wound down on March 31, 2022, after six years of supporting innovative, local community-driven solutions to address the root causes of poverty and improve the lives of those most affected by it.

LPRF-funded projects supported the implementation and evaluation of poverty-reduction services, creating partnerships among organizations across the province and building a body of evidence about what works and what doesn't.

Through the program, OTF funded 119 organizations and projects, including 21 Indigenous-led initiatives, and touched the lives of almost 340,000 people in Ontario. Its grants helped create 300 community-based jobs — 100 of those being full-time positions — and paved the way to additional external funding for nearly half the fund's grantees, at a total of more than \$27 million. Four out of five grantees continued delivering services after their LPRF funding was complete, achieving the programming sustainability the fund was aiming for.

Investment Streams

Our core business is investing in community-based initiatives that help build a healthy, vibrant and resilient Ontario now and for the long term.

Community Building Fund

In 2021, the Ontario government created the Community Building Fund as a key element of its 2020 Budget, *Ontario's Action Plan: Protect, Support, Recover*. The fund supported the recovery of some of the sectors hardest hit by COVID-19: sport and recreation, tourism, arts, culture, and heritage. As a grantmaker of choice, OTF was asked to deliver the Community Building Fund Operating and Capital streams to support non-profit organizations, Indigenous communities and municipalities. OTF also administered the Strategic Initiative stream on behalf of the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries.

Capital

To support the sport and recreation sector through the repair, renovation or retrofitting of existing facilities to address local community need or public health requirements identified through COVID-19.

Operating

To support the heritage, tourism, arts, culture, sport and recreation sectors with operating relief to help organizations remain viable so they can continue to improve quality of life for people in Ontario.

Strategic Initiatives

To support organizations in targeted sectors with unique needs that require more than the maximum program threshold and do not meet program criteria for the Operating or Capital streams.

Resilient Communities Fund

In 2020–2021, OTF launched the Resilient Communities Fund to help the non-profit sector rebuild capacity and recover from the impacts of COVID-19. In its second year, the fund shifted from stabilization and capacity building to helping organizations meet changing needs. Its flexible funding supported new approaches to program and service delivery, new equipment procurement, renovations and other adaptations.

The fund also helped organizations enhance their ability to access financial resources, develop new sources of revenue, or collaborate with other organizations in new ways to meet community needs. Outreach to diverse communities and underrepresented populations were particular priorities in 2021–2022, with a focus on helping organizations that directly support populations experiencing socio-economic, geographic, cultural and/or racial barriers.

Youth Opportunities Fund

The Youth Opportunities Fund offers grants and capacity-building support to grassroots groups and community-based collaboratives working to improve the wellbeing of children, youth and families who face systemic barriers, with a particular focus on Indigenous and Black communities. Since 2013, the Youth Opportunities Fund has provided more than \$95.7 million in funding to 315 groups across the province, making an impact on more than 276,000 people.

The Youth Opportunities Fund provides grants through three investment streams:

Youth Innovations

Grants that help youth-led grassroots groups and youth-adult partnerships test new ideas or grow successful projects.

Family Innovations

Grants that help grassroots groups deliver culturally anchored projects that empower and support parents, guardians and caregivers.

System Innovations

Grants that support collaboratives working to strengthen the quality and responsiveness of systems so they better serve youth.

In 2021–2022, we continued to award funds through a Youth Opportunities Fund investment stream developed in 2020–2021 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

COVID-19 Emergency Fund

Relief funds to help Black- and Indigenous-led groups address the pandemic-related needs of children, youth and families.

Action Areas

Our 10-year Investment Strategy introduced in 2015 identifies priority outcomes in six action areas that improve the quality of life for people in Ontario:

Active People

Fostering more active lifestyles

Inspired People

Enriching people's lives through arts, culture and heritage

Connected People

Building inclusive and engaged communities together

Promising Young People

Supporting the positive development of children and youth

Green People

Encouraging people to support a healthy and sustainable environment

Prosperous People

Enhancing people's economic well-being

These action areas align with the sectors OTF is mandated to fund: arts and culture, the environment, sports and recreation, and human and social services. They are based on long-term indicators of community wellbeing defined in the Canadian Index of Wellbeing (CIW). Launched in 2009 and now maintained by the University of Waterloo, the CIW researches and reports on quality of life nationally, provincially and locally.

Vital Action to Meet Pressing Needs

Many non-profit organizations found ways to pivot in the second year of the pandemic, adopting virtual models of operation and service delivery to continue their important work. Yet those centred on in-person activities weren't always able to do so, and many organizations also continued to struggle to raise funds to support their work. While more than half of all Ontario non-profits reported revenue losses in 2021–2022, for arts and sports organizations the proportions were 75% and 83%, respectively.

The provincial government responded in 2021 with the \$105 million **Community Building Fund** to support the longer-term recovery of organizations in arts and culture, heritage, tourism, sports, and recreation — sectors that contribute vitally to Ontario's social and economic fabric. OTF administered the Community Building Fund, awarding more than 800 grants to non-profits and Indigenous communities, including operating grants to sustain organizations while their usual programming and key fundraising activities were on pandemic hold and capital grants for the repair, renovation and retrofitting of existing facilities to address community needs and public health requirements.

Ongoing demand for support

Demand for funding continued to be high for the 2021-2022 round of the **Resilient Communities Fund**: OTF received 2,031 applications, including a significant increase in submissions from diverse groups including 2SLGBTQIA+, women, and racialized, Indigenous and Francophone communities. Applications from Black communities in particular almost doubled from previous funding rounds. In total, 1,146 Resilient Communities Fund grants were awarded to help organizations adapt to COVID-19 requirements, prepare for changing organizational and community needs, build resiliency, and develop alternative funding plans.

Optimism for the future

While the challenges of the pandemic will persist for some time, there is cause for optimism. Ontario's non-profit sector is starting to bounce back, with fewer organizations laying people off and almost a quarter (24%) hiring or planning to hire additional staff. According to research by the Ontario Nonprofit Network, two-thirds (67%) of organizations surveyed in 2021 are delivering programs and services virtually (up from 52% in 2020), and 40% are optimistic and expect their situation to improve.

Many grants that had to be paused due to pandemic restrictions are now underway again. As the non-profit sector moves toward a post-COVID future, we will continue to provide the supports to ensure it comes back stronger and more resilient than ever.

Review of Achievements

2021–2022

Our business plan sets out three strategic goals and supporting objectives and activities. Here’s what we achieved in 2021–2022.

Goal 1: Deliver grants that improve the lives of Ontarians

Objective: Invest granting budget into Ontario communities in line with OTF’s investment strategy

Community Building Fund: A year of supporting Ontario’s recovery

We disbursed \$96.9 million through the Community Building Fund in 2021–2022. That included 186 capital grants totalling \$45.9 million, 648 operating grants totalling \$46 million and 10 Strategic Initiative grants totalling \$4.9 million. The fund received 2,326 applications totalling \$293.2 million.

Resilient Communities Fund: Strengthening Ontario’s non-profit sector

Demand for grants under the Resilient Communities Fund remained strong in year two, with 2,029 applications totaling \$181.6 million in funding requested. We awarded 1,146 grants at a total investment of \$95.8 million to help non-profits. Grantees used funding for projects with multiple projected outcomes:

Seed, Grow and Capital streams

A total of 2,979 previously awarded grants under our Seed, Grow and Capital streams remain active and continue to be monitored.

Youth Opportunities Fund: Supporting Ontario’s children, youth and families

OTF received 87 applications for Youth Opportunities Fund grants in 2021–2022, totalling \$46.5 million in funding requests. We awarded \$14.2 million to 42 projects that will help children, youth and their families overcome systemic barriers that make it difficult for them to access the social and financial supports they need.

Investments were divided across the Youth Opportunities Fund’s three investment streams as follows:

In addition to the core Youth Opportunities Fund investment streams, the COVID-19 Emergency Fund allocated \$1.3 million to 53 initiatives across Ontario in 2021–2022, providing relief to help fill service delivery gaps and strengthen grantees’ organizational capacity to withstand and recover from the pandemic.

Overall, this year’s Youth Opportunities Fund grants to grassroots groups and community-based organizations are expected to have an impact on 7,590 youth, parents, guardians and caregivers across the province. While initiatives supported through the fund last year were concentrated mainly in urban/suburban areas, 14% of the 2021–2022 Youth Opportunities Fund investments committed were for projects benefitting children and youth in northern and remote communities.

Indigenous-led and Black-led organizations accounted for 26% and 67% of all new Youth Opportunities Fund grantees in 2021–2022, respectively. Grants were awarded to create safe spaces for youth to build strong community and cultural connections, to provide parents and caregivers with supports they need to ensure the well-being of their families, and to help youth enter the labour market and transition to sustainable career pathways.

Local Poverty Reduction Fund: Wrapping up a landmark program

Following a one-year extension due to COVID-19 disruptions, 2021–2022 was the final year of the Local Poverty Reduction Fund. The program funded 119 organizations and projects, including 21 Indigenous-led initiatives. According to final reports from grantees, it helped create 300 community-based jobs, of which more than 100 were full-time positions, and enabled almost half of grantees to secure additional external funding totalling more than \$27 million. Four out of five grantees continued their services after their LPRF funding was complete.

Grant Spotlights

Throughout Ontario, grantees are making an impact in their communities. These grant spotlights reflect the diversity of projects across our grant streams.

1) The Corporation of the **City of Kenora** has been awarded a \$260,000 Community Building Fund – Capital stream to create a fully accessible playground in Norman Park.

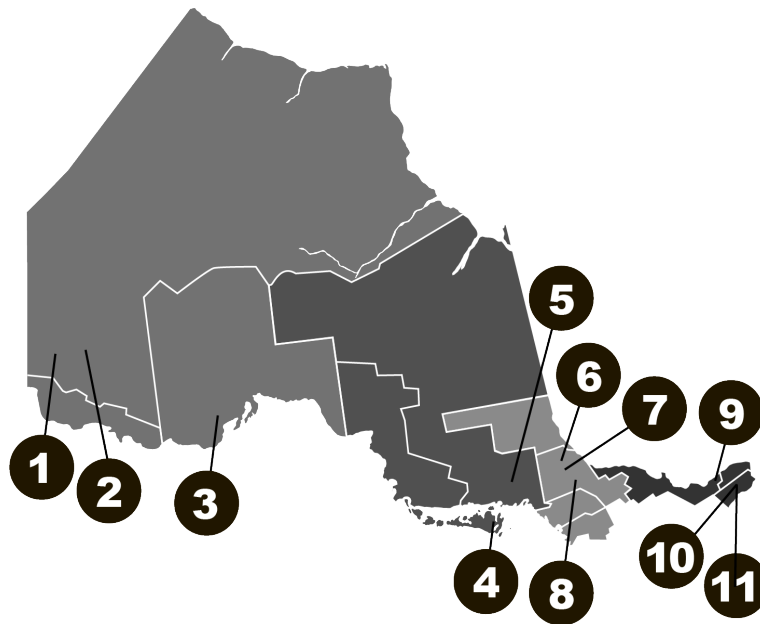

2) A \$395,800 Community Building Fund – Capital stream grant is supporting the **Wauzhushk Onigum Nation** as it renovates the only playground in the community.

3) A \$62,500 Seed grant assisted **EcoSuperior** with staffing and program costs as it delivered forest therapy experiences and deepened people's connections to the environment.

4) A \$76,000 Community Building Fund - Capital grant is helping the **Township of Tehkummah** be more barrier-free by retrofitting several of its recreation areas, such as its gazebo and playground.

5) The **Woodstock Sudbury Literary Festival** wrapped up its \$39,100 Seed grant where it developed a plan to make arts-based learning, and cultural and heritage experiences more inclusive and accessible for community members.

6) A \$1.5 million YOF Systems Innovations grant to **Ontario Federation of Indian Friendship Centres** supports their work to mobilize urban Indigenous community-based learning practices situated in Friendship Centre communities across Ontario.

7) A \$92,100 Resilient Communities Fund grant helped **Les Compagnons des francs loisirs** make artistic and cultural experiences available online for Francophones in Northern Ontario.

8) The **Royal Canadian Legion Branch 445 Callander** was awarded a \$310,200 Community Building Fund – Capital stream grant to install new lighting and dug-outs at its baseball fields and improve the accessibility of its facility.

9) **Legacy of Hope Foundation's** \$75,000 Seed grant helped pilot a sustainable Indigenous youth-run initiative to address food security and promote food sovereignty while building leadership skills for youth facing barriers.

10) **Maison des Arts** is continuing to safely deliver in-person and virtual dance, singing and visual arts lessons and workshops with a \$46,300 Community Building Fund - Operating grant that supports staffing and technology costs.

11) **Aunties on the Road: Indigenous Full Spectrum Doula Collective** (c/o Minwaashin Lodge - Indigenous Women's Support Centre) received \$20,000 received through YOF's Covid Emergency Fund, to provide care packages to pregnant and postpartum families, that included basic needs such as groceries and toiletries.

Objective: Supporting our grantees

Throughout 2021–2022, OTF continued to focus on providing excellent customer service to organizations applying for and receiving funding. During COVID-19, this included helping grantees navigate the uncertainties related to the pandemic, giving them the option to pause their grants and allowing for reasonable adjustments to the intended activities or purchases funds could be used for. Many delayed or paused grants resumed activities by year-end as organizations regained the ability to deliver some or all of their programming.

Reaching out to meet grantees' needs

Grant applicants are most likely to succeed when they understand the goals of the granting program so they can include the right information and emphasize the ways their project supports those goals. We offer many workshops, one-on-one coaching sessions and other opportunities for applicants to learn more about the granting process and set themselves up for success.

In 2021–2022, OTF offered 89 English and 18 French outreach sessions with 3,305 applicants about the Resilient Communities Fund and Community Building Fund programs. We also provided 4,869 English and 142 French one-on-one coaching sessions.

Prospective applicants to the Youth Opportunities Fund program accessed more than 320 hours of application coaching and networking supports. More than 300 people participated in our online information sessions, design workshops and application writing webinars. We engaged 440 community members through information webinars, virtual drop-in Q&A sessions and live virtual “Ask Me Anything” sessions hosted by current Youth Opportunities Fund grantees.

The combined customer satisfaction score across all investment streams was 86%, similar to 87% in 2020–2021, despite ongoing challenges associated with the pandemic. In addition, 86% of respondents said OTF was “helpful” and “timely” when providing support. Each year, a random sample of applicants and grantees is asked to rank how satisfied they are with OTF on a scale from 1 (extremely dissatisfied) to 5 (extremely satisfied). These scores represent the percentage of people who gave a rating of either 4 or 5.

In total, our support centre handled more than 5,600 emails and more than 12,000 phone calls from applicants and grantees in 2021–2022.

More than **400** people participated in Youth Opportunities Fund online information sessions, workshops and webinars.

Provided **5,011** one-on-one coaching sessions for applicants.

Volunteering to improve the lives of Ontarians

Last year we brought on 67 new volunteers to our grant review teams, which was a great support given the additional volume of funding requests in 2021–2022. In total, more than 300 volunteers across the province contributed their diverse perspectives and local knowledge to the application assessments and final funding recommendations for our Resilient Communities Fund, Community Building Fund and Youth Opportunities Fund investment streams, helping make granting decisions that align with the needs of Ontario’s communities.

Our volunteers assessed approximately 2,480 applications in 2021–2022, an increase of 21% over the previous year, which itself saw 200% more applications than a typical year.

Objective: Demonstrate impact of our investments

Diving deeper into key data

Last year, we continued to collect data on the impacts of COVID-19 on the not-for-profit sector and generated learnings from data we collected through research reports and grant applications. After introducing disaggregated demographic and race-based data in 2020–2021, we incorporated that data across all our investment streams. We are now using that data to ensure we are considering equity in our impact assessments and to create action plans to improve the accessibility of our funding to all people in Ontario.

We have enhanced our online measurement and evaluation reporting tools for the benefit of our grantees. Existing Grow grantees continue to be supported on their evaluation plans, and we have extended voluntary use of the online reporting tool to Seed grantees and Grow grantees not previously eligible.

These approaches to data collection, measurement and evaluation enable us and our grantees to report on and demonstrate the impact our investments are having in communities across Ontario.

Goal 2: Support Ontario’s non-profit sector to innovate and deliver greater impact

Objective: Advance the sector's capacity in research and development, accessing social finance, and making better use of data and evidence

In 2021–2022, we added 10 new partnerships under the umbrella of our Partnership Investments program, including partnerships focused on:

- Building the capacity of the non-profit and social impact sectors to **share learning** about broader system trends related to Partnership Investments priority areas
- Supporting the development of Canada’s first **Black-led and Black-serving** philanthropic foundation
- Supporting **community-based social finance** intermediaries and building capacity to enable community organizations to qualify for financing opportunities

We also hosted or participated in 90 virtual events throughout the year to help connect, engage and support the sector, including convenings of partners, conferences, presentations and webinars/workshops.

The 10 new partnerships established last year involve 50 organizations in total, including the Ontario Nonprofit Network, Community Foundations of Canada, l’Assemblée de la francophonie de l’Ontario, Turtle Island Institute, Abilities Centre, Philanthropic Foundations of Canada, and the Circle on Philanthropy and Aboriginal Peoples in Canada.

These partnerships are valued at more than \$6.4 million in monetary contributions and in-kind support, which includes information sharing and technical assistance with program evaluation and measurement. In total, we invested \$1.6 million last year in new partnerships. Our partners provided \$4.8 million in monetary and in-kind contributions — meaning we leveraged \$2.97 for every dollar invested in these partnerships.

Our partnerships with foundations, businesses, networks, governments, Indigenous organizations, Francophone groups, academia, social purpose organizations and others help us build capacity and support innovation in Ontario’s non-profit sector.

Grant Spotlights

Throughout Ontario, grantees are making an impact in their communities. These grant spotlights reflect the diversity of projects across our grant streams.

1) With a \$39,000 Community Building Fund – Operating stream grant, **Caring Kids Concerts** paid for salaries and purchased video streaming equipment to deliver online programming.

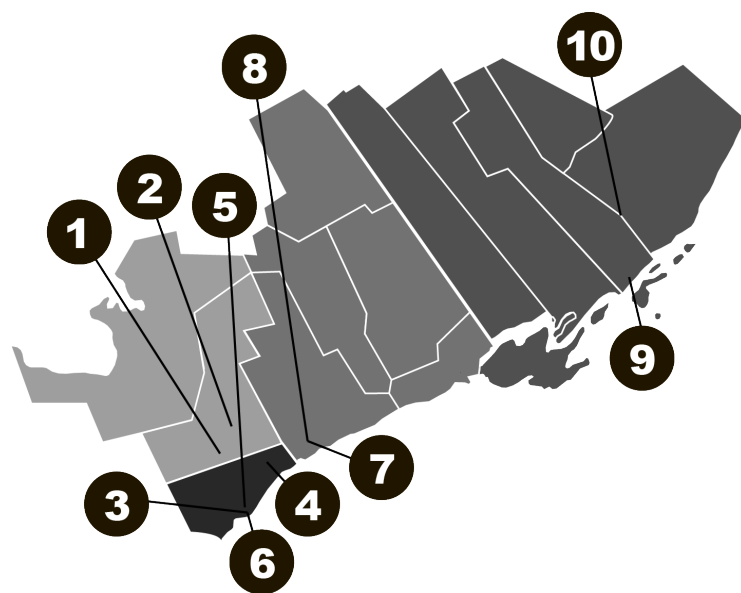

2) **Beth Joseph Chabad** completed its project with a \$186,300 Grow grant by expanding an inter-generational volunteer program that reduced social isolation for Holocaust survivors.

3) Through the **Rainbow Songs Foundation**, a \$10,000 Resilient Communities Fund grant supported musicians as they offered free virtual music lessons to underserved children living in shelters.

4) A \$500,000 Community Building Fund – Capital stream grant helped **Variety Village** as it upgraded the HVAC system and improved access to the facility.

5) **Parents of Black Children** (c/o Youth Empowering Parents) received a \$20,000 YOF Covid Emergency Fund grant within the Family Innovations stream to support Black children and families in Toronto to access a mental health expert; learning and technology supports; and other resources.

6) **SoundCheck** (c/o The HopeWorks Connection) was awarded a \$210,000 YOF Youth Innovations grant to provide a safe space for Black and racialized youth ages 15 to 25 by using music as a catalyst to build strong bonds and collaboration.

7) A \$74,800 Seed grant supported **Durham Deaf Services** as it developed materials in English and American Sign Language to encourage Deaf empowerment and engagement and help marginalized community members take on leadership roles.

Goal 3: Be a high-value partner in the delivery of public funds

Objective: Demonstrate effective and accountable stewardship of public funds

Maintaining trust, transparency and accountability in the province's finances is one of the government's highest priorities. Through effective, efficient systems and smart budgetary management, we ensure that more public funds are spent on community-based programs rather than our own administration, maximizing the return on provincial investment. In 2021–2022, our administrative expenditures equalled about 1% of our total revenue.

Tracking impact and supporting grantee success

Every year, we complete an internal audit to make sure grantees adhere to their contracts as well as our policies, requirements and standards. Last year's results found an 88% compliance rate for our grantees. One reason for this high level of compliance is our commitment to fair, consistent and transparent processes. Our staff connect with all successful applicants as soon as funding has been awarded to ensure all involved have a solid understanding of the grant contract, particularly around audit expectations and processes. We then follow up with grantees as needed to bring them to full compliance.

Delivering better service with an enhanced IT infrastructure

With most employees still working from home, cybersecurity continued to be an important issue last year. We conducted security and vulnerability assessments to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of our data and systems and developed a Cybersecurity Incident Response Plan in case of problems. We also migrated our IT managed services to a new provider with minimal impact and interruption to staff.

To improve the grantee and applicant experience, we made several enhancements to our Youth Opportunities Fund grant management system.

Recognizing grantees

Many grants continued to be announced and recognized through news releases and virtual events. However, as the province opened up, some recognition events started to be held in person again. A total of 826 recognition activities took place, and 707 of those included participation from Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs).

Supporting our staff and volunteers

Staff health and wellness remained an OTF priority throughout the year. We continued our efforts to maximize engagement as we worked remotely, with regular check-ins, CEO townhalls, wellness sessions and learning opportunities. Learning opportunities covered key topics including our equity, diversity and inclusion initiatives and our Anti-Black Racism Action Plan. These supports have helped our employees remain agile and resilient during the ongoing impacts of the pandemic, enabling them to continue delivering on our mandate with service excellence. According to last year's pulse surveys on employee engagement, 87% of our staff agreed or strongly agreed with the statement: "I am inspired to give my very best." These results and supports have enabled our employees to remain agile, and resilient during the continued impact of the pandemic in order to deliver on our mandate.

We also provided training and support to help our volunteers complete their assessments, make effective decisions by mitigating bias and use our grant management system effectively.

Objective: Explore new granting opportunities with government partners to deliver on shared priorities

OTF was pleased to partner with the Ontario Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries to deliver the Community Building Fund in 2021-2022. This fund supports the government's goals of helping local and community-based organizations in hard-hit sectors recover from the effects of the pandemic.

- **Operating:** Funding for non-profits and Indigenous communities that operated facilities or delivered programs in the arts and culture, heritage, tourism, and sport and recreation sectors to help sustain their operations in the short term and create new attractions/experiences as they emerged from the impacts of the pandemic to support and improve the quality of life in their communities while also providing needed services, jobs and educational opportunities to Ontarians.
- **Capital:** Funding for municipalities and non-profit sport and recreation organizations that operated facilities open to the public to rehabilitate and renovate these spaces and infrastructure to meet both public health protocols and the needs of the local community.
- **Strategic Initiatives:** Funding for municipalities and non-profit organizations that operated in the sectors addressed through the Operating and Capital streams and had unique projects or challenges.

OTF has also partnered with Economic and Social Development Canada to advance social innovation and social finance across the province and beyond. A \$750,000 grant provided by ESDC will enable us to support individual and regional community capital partners to build a stronger social finance system.

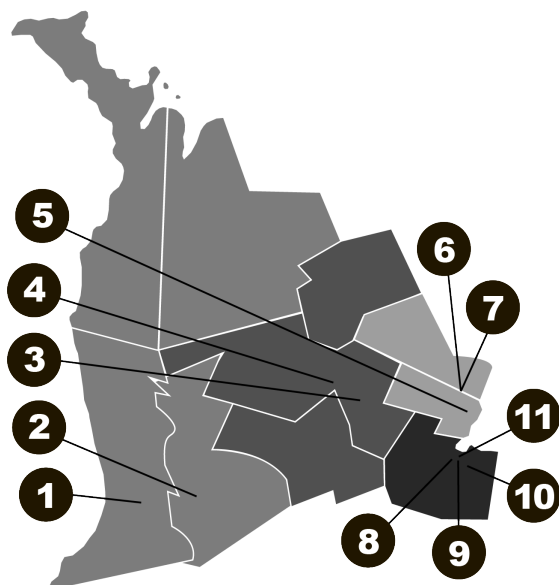

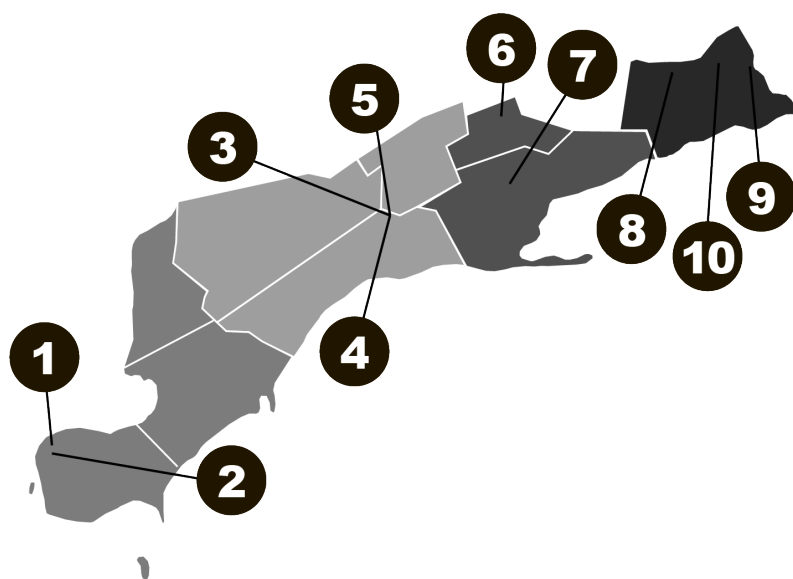

Notes to Financial Statements

Year ended March 31, 2022

Ontario Trillium Foundation (the "Foundation" or "OTF"), an agency of the Ministry of Heritage, Sports, Tourism and Culture Industries ("MHSTCI"), is financially supported by the Ontario government. OTF began operations as an arm's-length agency of the Ontario government on August 23, 1982 and was incorporated without share capital under the laws of Ontario under letters patent dated November 17, 1982. OTF's purpose is to build healthy and vibrant communities throughout Ontario, by strengthening the capacity of the voluntary sector through investments in community-based initiatives.

Government funding is subject to Memoranda of Understanding that define how the funds must be invested and distributed.

1. Significant accounting policies:

The financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian public sector accounting standards, including the 4200 standards for government not-for-profit organizations.

(a) Revenue recognition:

OTF follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions, which include government funding. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Externally restricted contributions are deferred and recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred.

Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis.

(b) Financial instruments:

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value on initial recognition. All other financial instruments are subsequently recorded at cost or amortized cost unless management has elected to carry the instruments at fair value. The Foundation has not elected to carry any such financial instruments at fair value.

Financial instruments are adjusted by transaction amortized costs incurred on acquisition and financing costs, which are amortized using the effective interest rate method.

Year ended March 31, 2022

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

All financial assets are assessed for impairment on an annual basis. When a decline is determined to be other than temporary, the amount of the loss is reported in the statement of operations.

As financial instruments are recorded at cost or amortized costs, a statement of remeasurement gains and losses has not been included.

(c) Grants:

Grants awarded by the Foundation are recorded as grants pledged expenses in the year that the Foundation approves the grant.

Grants awarded by third party organizations for which the Foundation acts as an administrative agent are recorded as agent grant payments when payments are issued.

(d) Allocation of support services expenses:

The Foundation classifies expenses on the statement of operations by function. The Foundation allocates certain costs by identifying the appropriate basis of allocating and applying that basis consistently each year. The Foundation allocates its support services expenses proportionately on a per capita basis.

(e) Capital assets:

Capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a straight-line basis over the following periods:

(f) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Items subject to estimates and assumptions include the allocation of expenses. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

All investments, excluding the laddered bond portfolio, are in cash or cash equivalents, or in fixed income securities and mature within the next 7 months (2021 - 7 months). These fixed income investments bear interest from 0.428% to 1.04% (2021 - 0.10% to 0.698%).

In OTF's laddered bond portfolio, all bond investments are in fixed income securities and have maturity dates between 5 months and 3 years (2021 - 2 months and 2.5 years). These investments bear interest from 0.376% to 1.758% (2021 - 0.376% to 2.368%).

The Ontario Financing Authority acts as OTF's investment manager under an investment management agreement that adheres to OTF's policies and procedures governing risk and also includes additional risk concern measures.

All investments purchased starting April 1, 2019 are recorded at cost. Investments purchased prior to April 1, 2019 are recorded at amortized cost.

- (a) Deferred contributions represent funding received from Ministries that has not yet been pledged as grants, paid to Local Poverty Reduction Fund ("LPRF") grantees or spent on operations. These funds are restricted until grants are approved by the Board of Directors and pledged to third parties, LPRF grant conditions are met and payments are made or until operating expenditures are made. OTF has controls in place to ensure that the restrictions on grant pledges are met prior to utilization of these funds.

Youth Opportunities Fund:

On November 7, 2013, the Foundation signed an agreement with the Ministry of Children and Youth Services ("MCYS") to administer the Youth Opportunities Fund ("YOF") to provide grants for community-based and positive youth development projects that improve conditions for youth who face multiple barriers to positive outcomes in the Greater Toronto Area. On October 8, 2015, the Foundation signed an amending agreement to expand the YOF program throughout the province. On August 30, 2016, the Foundation signed a service contract with MCYS to deliver additional YOF grants, focused on civic engagement, supported through the time-limited Ontario150 initiative. In 2019, the program was expanded to include the Family Innovation Stream.

Local Poverty Reduction Fund:

On November 19, 2015, the Foundation signed an agreement with the Provincial Government and MHSTCI to act as an administrative agent for the Local Poverty Reduction Fund, a granting program to provide funding to support innovative, community-driven projects that measurably improve the lives of those most affected by poverty. The transactions were deferred until such time that grant payments were made or operating expenses are incurred. The Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services ("MCCSS") was responsible for application review and approval, and the Foundation supported applicants through the application process and manages the grants once they were approved.

The total funding received from MCCSS was \$49,371,625 over six years. During 2022, nil (2021 - \$1,448,526) was received, and \$4,245,800 (2021 - \$2,762,604) included in the agent grants paid represents carry forward of grants not paid in prior years.

Ontario150 Community Capital Program:

On December 13, 2016, the Foundation signed an agreement with MHSTCI to administer the Ontario150 Community Capital Program, a one-time funding program launched as part of the Province of Ontario's 150th anniversary. The purpose of the program was to strengthen communities by supporting the repair, renovation or retrofitting of existing infrastructure to better address the diverse needs of Ontario communities while fostering economic growth. In 2021, the balance of the rescinds and recoveries were returned to the General Revenue Fund of the Government.

Community Building Fund:

On February 11, 2021, the Foundation signed an agreement with MHSTCI to administer the Community Building Fund Program. The total funding received from MHSTCI was \$105,000,000. The purpose of the program was to provide recovery support to municipalities, Indigenous communities and non-profit organizations in the heritage, sport and recreation, tourism, and culture sectors impacted by COVID-19. The program was a time-limited, application-based program that will provide funding to eligible organizations through three funding streams: (i) Operating Funding; (ii) Capital Funding; and (iii) Strategic Initiatives. Operating Funding provided emergency operating relief. Capital Funding supported investments in infrastructure repairs, rehabilitation and renovation, in order to meet public health protocols and local community needs. Strategic Initiative Grants were approved by the Minister of Heritage, Sports, Tourism and Cultural Industries for organizations that required more than the maximum program threshold and/or did not meet program parameters.

- (b) Once OTF pledges grants for distribution, the grants are recorded as grants payable. Grants pledged and not yet distributed are payable, subject to the receipt of funds by OTF and to certain performance conditions placed on the recipients. 5. Allocation of expenses:

The Foundation allocates certain of its support services expenses based on the proportion of the total staff directly involved with grantmaking and partnership grants. The following percentages were used to calculate the allocation: grantmaking, 55.8% (2021 - 52.21%) and partnership grants, 0.72% (2021 - 0.74%).

Support services reported in the statement of operations of \$2,220,206 (2021 - \$2,632,676) are reported after allocation of \$3,836,200 (2021 - \$3,471,777) to grantmaking expenses and \$39,900 (2021 - \$39,569) to partnership grants.

6. Partnership grants:

Partnership grants are grants to non-profit organizations that perform activities such as research and development, convening, knowledge sharing, capacity building and providing technical assistance to the sector. These partnerships are innovative in nature and their objective is to maximize impact across the sector and the province. Grants are issued in accordance with OTF's Partnership Investment Policy introduced in 2021.

In relation to these leases, OTF has agreed to indemnify the landlord against losses occurring on the lease premises which may arise out of a breach of the lease agreement.

8. Indemnification of officers and directors:

OTF has indemnified its past, present and future directors, officers, employees and volunteers against expenses (including legal expenses), judgments, and any amount actually or reasonably incurred by them in connection with any action, suit or proceeding in which the directors are used as a result of their service, if they acted honestly and in good faith with a view to the best interests of OTF. The nature of the indemnity prevents OTF from reasonably estimating the maximum exposure. OTF has purchased directors' and officers' liability insurance with respect to this indemnification.

9. Financial risks:

(a) Liquidity risk:

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Foundation will be unable to fulfill its obligations on a timely basis or at a reasonable cost. The Foundation manages its liquidity risk by monitoring its operating requirements. The Foundation prepares budget and cash forecasts to ensure it has sufficient funds to fulfill its obligations.

Accounts payable and accrued liabilities are generally due within 60 days of receipt of an invoice.

There have been no significant changes to the liquidity risk exposure from 2021.

(b) Market risk:

Market risk is the risk that changes in market prices, such as foreign exchange rates or interest rates, will affect the Foundation's income or the value of its holdings of financial instruments. The objective of market risk management is to control market risk exposures within acceptable parameters while optimizing return on investment.

In the month of March 2020, the COVID-19 outbreak was declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization and has had a significant financial, market and social dislocating impact. The market are experiencing fluctuation that does expose the Foundation to increased market risk as compared to 2021. The current events and conditions are expected to be temporary, however there is uncertainty around the length of the disruption and impact on future operations.

(c) Interest rate risk:

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value of future cash flows or a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in the market interest rates.

Financial assets and financial liabilities with variable interest rates expose the Foundation to cash flow interest rate risk. The Foundation is exposed to this risk through its investments.

As at March 31, 2022, had prevailing interest rates increased or decreased by 1%, assuming a parallel shift in the yield curve, with all other variables held constant, the estimated impact on the market value of bonds would approximate \$1,240,000.

The Foundation's investments are disclosed in note 2.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic as noted in market risk, the markets are experiencing fluctuation that does expose the Foundation to enhanced interest rate risk as compared to 2021.
