Academy Theatre Foundation

\$8,000 over one year to complete an engineering study and develop a strategic business plan for the theatre, so it can plan for upgrades and improve overall sustainability.

AIDS Committee of Durham

\$25,000 over six months to complete a broad community evaluation of the High Risk Youth HIV/AIDS Outreach Project with an aim to redesign the program to be delivered in a more effective way and increase the level of partnership and community ownership.

Ajax Budokan Judo Club

\$25,000 over two months to furnish the newly renovated judo club with mats, carpets and bleachers.

The Ajax Rising Stars Special Olympic Figure Skating Club

\$24,100 over two years to support the operating costs of the Ajax Rising Stars Skating Club, which provides learn-to-skate and competitive skating opportunities for developmentally challenged children and youth.

Alzheimer Society Durham

\$118,400 over years years to develop and establish activities and tools to augment and diversify the Society's revenue base to ensure long-term sustainability and growth to meet the growing service and educational needs in the community.
