Alcohol and Drug Referral Centre of Kingston

\$19,300 over three years to provide substance abuse counseling, training for health & social service professionals & community development initiatives addressing substance abuse in rural Northern Frontenac County.

Algonquin Arts Council

\$25,000 over six months towards renovations and equipment for the Bancroft Village Playhouse to improve accessibility, safety and operating efficiency.

Almonte and District Arts Council

\$13,000 over one year to host the Bach Comes to Almonte festival in May 2000, which will bring Canadian musicians together for a series of millennium concerts to commemorate the 250th anniversary of Bach's death.

Almonte Community Co-ordinators

\$21,300 over six months for renovations to improve accessibility to "The Hub" community centre in Almonte, by installing wheelchair accessible washrooms, door openers and making improvements to the entrance.
